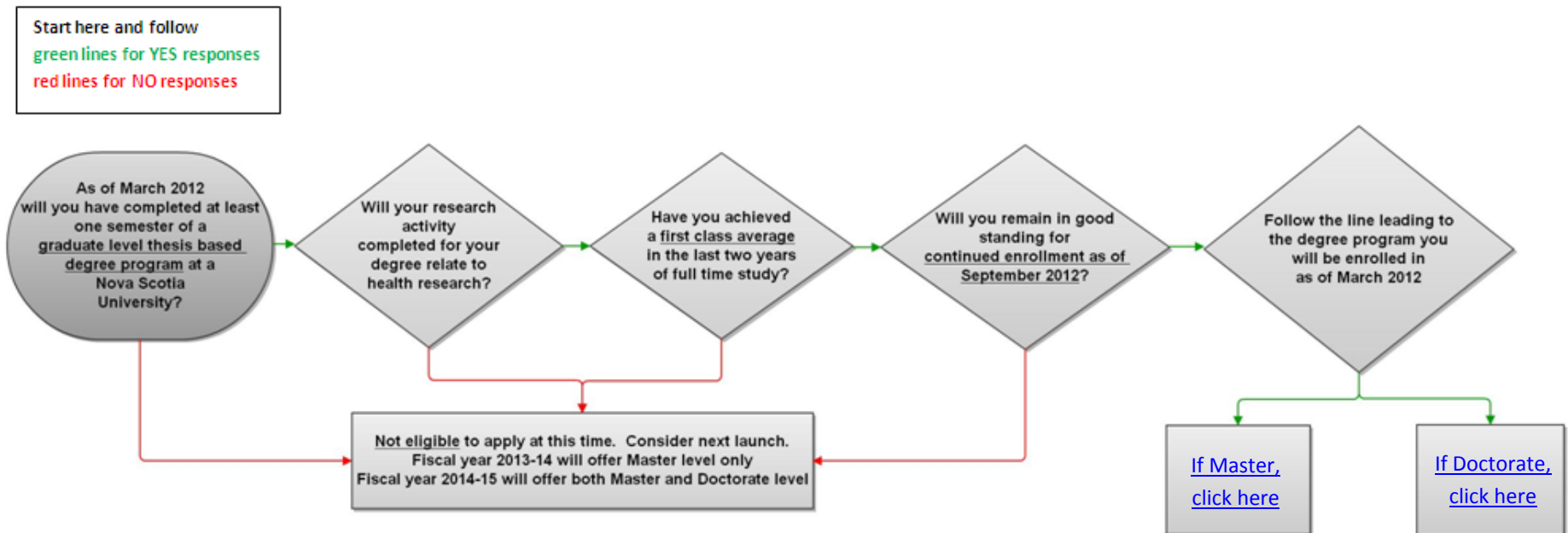

2012-13 NSHRF Scotia Scholarship

Master level

Funding Value and Duration:

The Master level Scotia Scholarship is for one year in duration valued up to \$10,000.
The Doctorate level Scotia Scholarship is for up to two years in duration and valued up to \$20,000 (\$10,000 per year). Funded applicants must take up their awards in September 2012.

When can I apply?

You must contact your university immediately to determine the university's internal application deadline. A complete application package must be submitted to your university by that deadline.

What do I need to submit with my application?

A complete application package includes: application form, Common CV validated for NSHRF, transcripts of all academic training, plain language summary outlining your research activities, statement of promise, letters of reference and optional attachments if you wish to be considered for additional awards. Do I need to submit anything to NSHRF or just to my university?

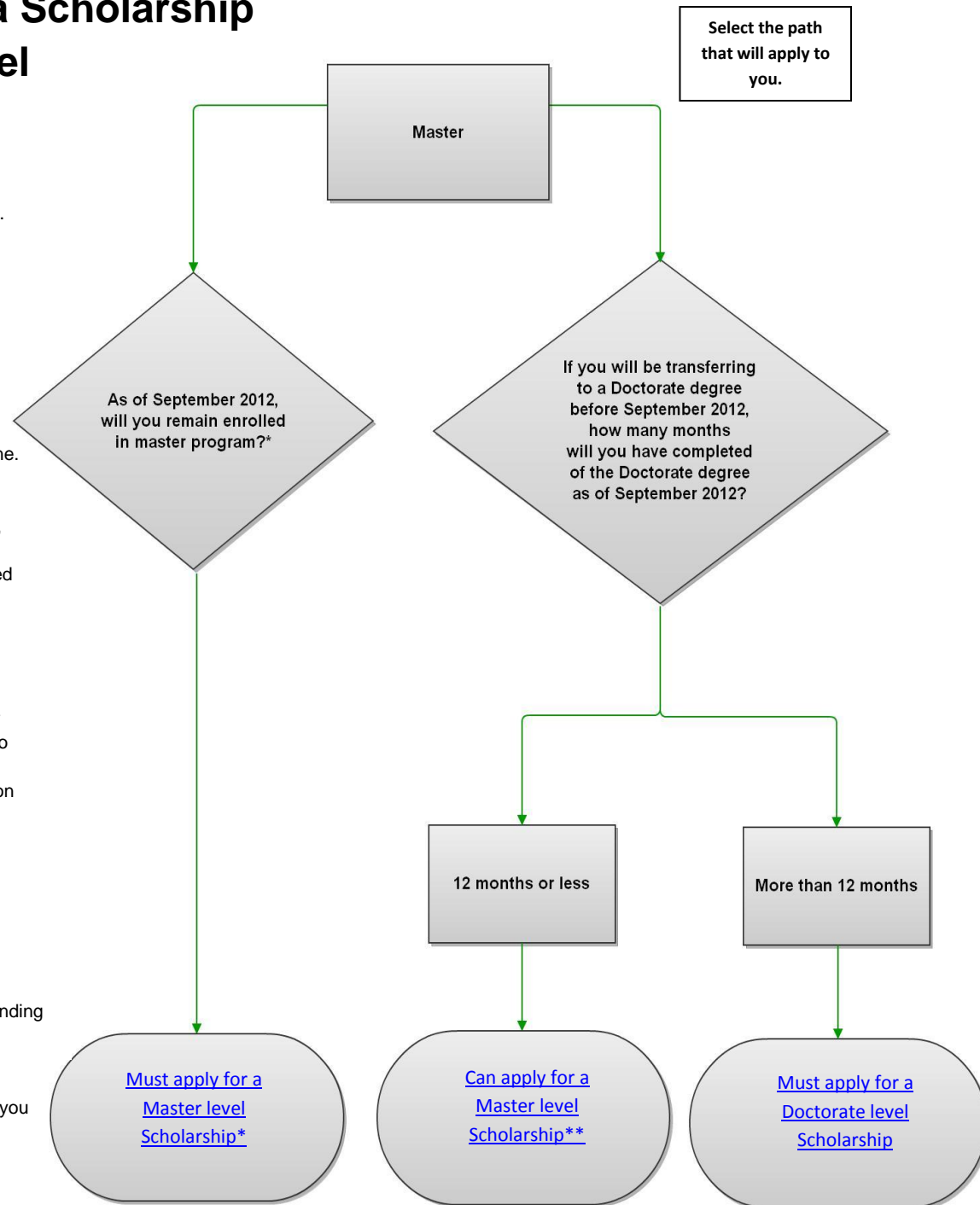
